Swapan Bhattacharya is the Managing Director of TCG Lifesciences Limited (formerly "Chembiotek Research International"), a leading life sciences research services and Informatics Company in India and part of The Chatterjee Group (TCG), a global investment conglomerate headquartered in New York. Mr. Bhattacharya joined TCG in 1995 and in 2001 assumed responsibility to develop and expand TCG's life sciences business. Under his able leadership the Company has grown in stature and size having developed integrated research and development capabilities from early biology to clinical research thereby spanning the entire pharmaceutical value chain.

He has successfully established trust based relationships with 15 of the top 20 global pharmaceutical companies. In 2007, to expand and strengthen the integrated service platform, Clininvent Research Pvt. Ltd. a 'clinical trials' company and Labvantage Inc. a 'laboratory information management systems' company, were acquired by TCG Lifesciences. He has also successfully forged a relationship with Government of India to operate and manage 'The Centre for Genomic Application', India's largest core share service facility in genomics and proteomics in public-private-partnership mode. His dynamic leadership and vision has successfully positioned TCG Lifesciences globally as a preferred partner in the area of drug discovery and development.

Prior to joining TCG, Mr. Bhattacharya worked for PaineWebber Inc. (currently UBS PaineWebber) from 1987 to 1995. From 1980 to 1987, Mr. Bhattacharya was Advisor to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission where he was responsible for developing strategies in the disposal of nuclear materials and waste.
