Joeri Borstlap is co-ordinator of the Berlin-Brandenburg Center for Regenerative Therapies (BCRT) at the Charité – Universitätsmedizin Berlin. He received his Master of Science in Architectural Engineering in 1996 from the University of Delft, The Netherlands. Since then, he has been active in the organisation and co-ordination of several international projects ranging from the management of architectural competitions, organisation of awareness campaigns and the implementation of large scale IT and communication projects in the fields of architecture, telecommunications and medicine. From 1997 until 2002 Joeri Borstlap was founder and CEO of the new media agency form@ in Berlin. Since 2002 he is appointed at the Charité and has developed CellNet.Org into an internationally recognized networking organization in the field of regenerative medicine. Out of this context he has successfully coordinated the foundation of the BCRT (www.b-crt.de), the Regenerative Medicine Initiative Germany (RMIG), the European Human Embryonic Stem Cell Registry – hESCreg (www.hescreg.eu) and the allocation of Pharmicell-Europe in Berlin-Brandenburg (www.pharmicell.eu).

The Berlin-Brandenburg Center for Regenerative Therapies (BCRT) is a collaboration between the Charité – Universitätsmedizin Berlin, and Germany's largest research organization, the Helmholtz association. It was established in early 2007 to develop an internationally visible center of excellence in Regenerative Medicine with a focus on targeted cell differentiation for promoting endogenous tissue regeneration. It aims to translate basic science discoveries into regenerative therapies, and to share generated scientific knowledge in Regenerative Medicine with researchers, clinicians, and the public. Initially, the Center emphasis on research and clinical programs related to musculoskeletal and immunological applications, since these aspects of regenerative medicine are most advanced at the Charité and they are closest to clinical translation.
